Evaluating the impact of the partnership approach

- What difference does the partnership approach make compared to 'traditional' commissioning?
- How well does the service design approach work in the context of extra-familial harm?
- To what extent are solutions coproduced with children, families and communities?
- What should be the focus and approach for future phases of evaluation? (Depending on how the collaboration evolves)



Adding value

- We will evaluate the partnership and service design work not do (or redo) it
- We are working closely with the project team to avoid duplication and get maximum benefit from activities
- Rather than do things in parallel we aim to work alongside e.g. providing interviewers from our pool of researchers to share initial engagement with children, families and communities (subject to Research Ethics Committee approval)



Key activities

- Workshop with the project team to develop a theory of change
- Finalise the evaluation framework
- Establishing the baseline from data, service mapping and stakeholder views (alongside project team)
- Gathering qualitative and quantitative data for first phase of evaluation (alongside project team)
- Reporting
 - Baseline report June
 - Final report September
